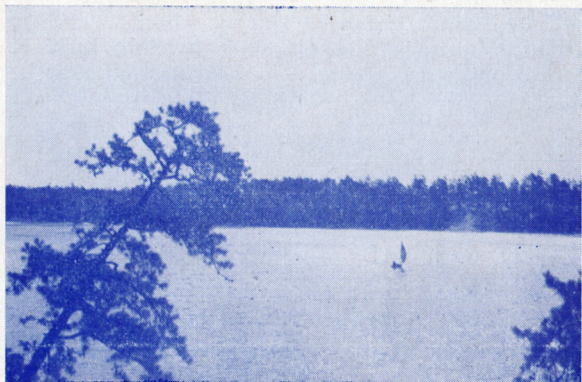

COST AND RESERVATION INFORMATION

\$11.00 per week of which \$4.00 is payable at time of reservation and the balance of \$7. one week before entering Camp. You may register from one to seven weeks in which case \$4.00 for each week registered is payable at the time of reservation and the balance one week before entering Camp.

FOOD AND RATION POINTS

Fresh meats, vegetables, and milk are served daily. There will be plenty of food served and *second helpings* are not only permitted but encouraged. *All menus are approved by the Camp Doctor insuring a well balanced diet.*

You **MUST** bring your Ration Book with you. It is part of your camp entrance credentials. Points will be taken from it in accordance with O.P.A. rulings. Your length of stay determines the number of points which will be deducted from your Ration Book. Your Ration Book will be returned to you when you leave Camp.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Supervision is given to all departments and to all activities by *trained leaders*. A resident physician is in attendance *at all times* at the Health Lodge. Your parents will be notified in case of severe illness. The Mather Memorial Hospital at Port Jefferson is available for emergency cases.

Red Cross Life Saving Instructors are on guard at the Waterfront *at all times*.

Every precaution is taken to safeguard YOU so that you will have a happy vacation.

TRANSPORTATION

By train from Mineola to Manorville and by bus from Manorville to Camp Wauwepex. Approximate cost \$2.72 round trip. Send your transportation fees when you make your reservation. The Council will purchase your tickets and keep them for you.

Train leaves Mineola Station Friday of each week at 9:22 A.M.

You and your Scout brothers meet at the Mineola Station, eastbound side.
