hey said they were our friends, here only to ask for help in solving an ecological disaster on their home planet. They promised medical and scientific advances. And claimed they would do their best to minimize the disruption of Earth society.

As the world eventually discovered, the alien "Visitors" were here for a far more sinister purpose: while they did indeed have an ecological problem at home, their solution was shocking. Their seemingly human appearance disguised the fact that the Visitors were a reptilian race who considered humans as a food source. Their vast armada of spaceships contained storage lockers which would be used to haul the Earth's population away, much like a fleet of space-bound cattle trucks.
